

BIOGRAPHY - KEYNOTE SPEAKERS

Dr. Martha S. Burns serves on the faculty of Northwestern University, department of Communication Sciences and Disorders, and is a fellow of the American Speech Language Hearing Association. Dr. Burns has been a practicing clinician for 40 years in the Chicago area and received honors from Northwestern University, Evanston Hospital Corporation, the American Speech Language Hearing Foundation, and St. Xavier University. She is the author of a book on aphasia and the test Burns Brief Inventory of Communication and Cognition which was published by the Psychological Corporation. Her book on Right Hemisphere Dysfunction was selected as one of the best health science books of the year by Dooby's Rating Service. Dr. Burns has also published numerous articles on language development, language disorders, auditory processing disorders, and adult neurological disorders in professional journals. She currently serves as the Director of Clinical Specialist Market at Scientific Learning Corporation.

Dr. Nancy Greenwald, a board certified physiatrist, has served as the Medical Director of the Outpatient Brain Injury Program at Elks Rehab Hospital (ERH) since 2000. For 10 years she has also provided inspiring leadership and clinical expertise to ERH's inpatient brain injury program. She has been a leading force in the development of an integrated team approach, and adherence to comprehensive guidelines in caring for the agitated patient. Dr. Greenwald is known for her deft touch in fine tuning the pharmacological program that enables her patients to successfully engage in their environment. Dr. Greenwald has been recognized by the National Guard for caring for returning soldiers, as well as the MS society for her ongoing work and care of patients.

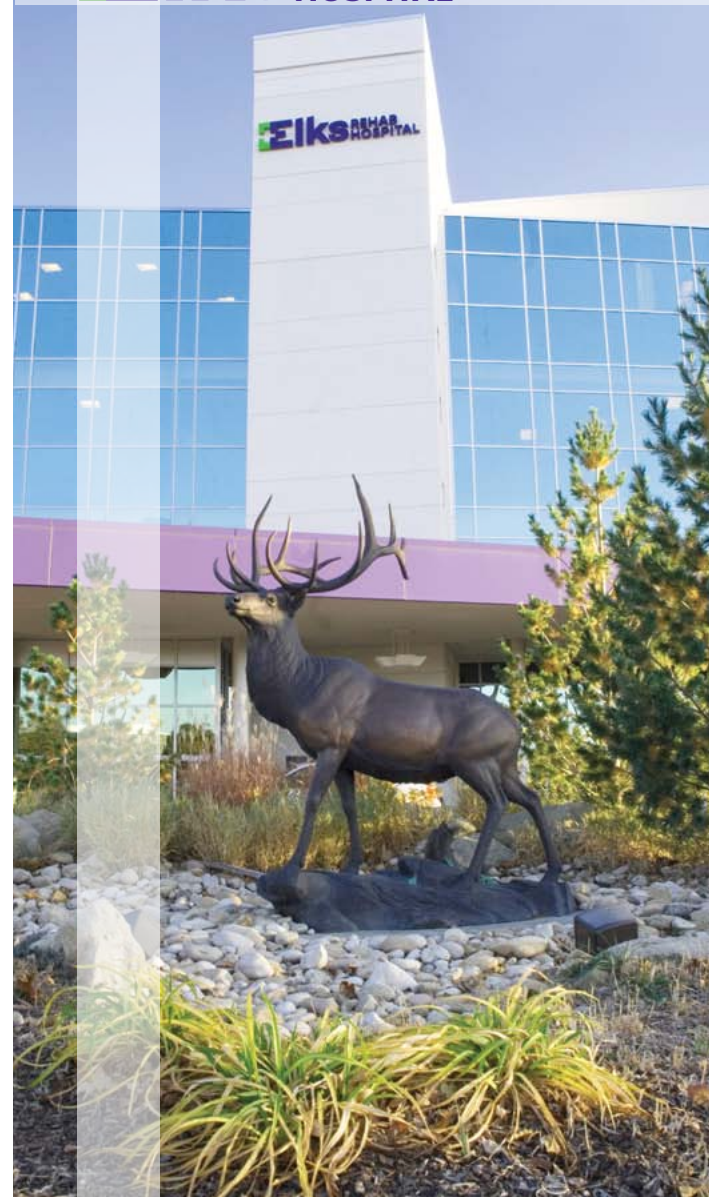

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Elks Rehab Hospital (ERH) presents our annual Brain Injury Symposium 2011. This year focuses on a multi disciplinary approach to maximize recovery from brain injuries.

Dr. Martha S. Burns, keynote speaker, will discuss how the team can apply and immediately implement aspects of current research in neurodevelopment and neuropathology. We will also offer classes focused on agitation management, organizational strategies, divided attention, staff safety, and community reintegration. Presenters include Dr. Nancy Greenwald, Director of the Outpatient Brain Injury Program at ERH and several highly skilled members of our therapy, nursing and social work staff.

What characterizes an ERH symposium is our group of speakers who are current practitioners with extensive backgrounds and real successes in treating people with brain injuries. You will leave this conference with ideas and tools that will maximize your patient's rehab potential and recovery.
